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Season Highlights

The 2017-18 will be remembered as the inaugural year of new Music Director Maestro Christian Kluxen's tenure with the Victoria Symphony. His enthusiasm, passion for music and connection with both the musicians and the audience reinforced the Symphony's mission of enriching lives through the shared experience of extraordinary music.

nearly 50 countries for a festival of new music and a celebration of new ideas, new collaborations, and new fusions in an astonishing 35+ concerts and events over seven days featuring more than 135 works by 130 composers.

As a part of their Canadian tour, the National Arts Centre Orchestra also performed in Victoria.

Smashing Success

This season saw nine sell out concerts in a variety of different venues and series. Beer & Beethoven and Mozart & Martinis continued to deliver sold out houses indicating our expansion into unique venues presenting a mix of food, alcohol and music is a winning combination.

Four of five of the Classics series concerts were presented to sold out houses as well as Maestra Miller's return to conduct Rachmaninoff in the Masterworks series. The holiday season also produced two sell outs in the matinee performance of Handel's *Messiah* and Jann Arden.

Canadian throat singer Tanya Tagaq drew a sell-out crowd in the Exploration series as she wowed the audience with her transfixing performance.

Collaborations

This season saw collaborations with four notable artistic organizations in Victoria. Talented young musicians of the Greater Victoria Youth Orchestra joined the VS onstage for Holst's *The Planets*. Ballet Victoria showcased their talents in At the Ballet in the Pops series and A Viennese New Years. Canadian College of Performing Arts students joined the VS for Broadway Lights and Victoria Choral Society performed both Handel's *Messiah* and Verdi's *Requiem*.

Blading at the Royal?

Figure skating legend Kurt Browning won the hearts of the Symphony audience by roller skating to Singin in the Rain...a first at the Royal Theatre!

Joining the Team

In late October, the VS also announced the appointment of Sean O'Loughlin as Principal Pops Conductor, a position left vacant since Brian Jackson's retirement in 2012/13 season. Sean's background of arranging, composing and conducting will strengthen the VS Pops series for years to come.

Community Engagement

The 2017-18 was the inaugural year of the "Adopt a School Program". Because of the generous donation of Beverly Unger VS musicians gave in-school performances for a record breaking 4,950 students. For many of these students this was their first experience hearing professional classical music.

We look forward to welcoming these students at future concerts with the VS.

I look forward to another good year in 2018-19.






CEO's Report

The 2017-18 season witnessed the launch of Maestro Christian Kluxen to great acclaim as the new Music Director of the Victoria Symphony. The fusion of Christian's energy, authenticity and extraordinary musicianship resulted in exhilarating concerts and enthusiastic audiences. We continued to showcase renowned artists including Canadians James Ehnes and Jon Kimura Parker as well as rising conductors Nathan Brock and Jordan de Souza. We presented some of the great masterpieces of the classical repertoire, opening the year with Mahler's Symphony no. 1 and closing with Verdi's *Requiem*; diversified our Pops Series with a magical concert narrated by Canadian skating legend Kurt Browning; presented beloved Canadian artists Jann Arden and Inuit Throat Singer Tanya Tagaq; and continued our valued and critical partnerships with Pacific Opera Victoria and Dance Victoria. In addition, we were delighted to announce the appointment of our new Pops Conductor, Sean O'Loughlin, who takes up the reins of the Pops series commencing in September 2018. Sean will bring a breadth of expertise and creativity to our Pops programs, and we look forward to his arrival with enthusiasm and delight.

Of significance this year was the success of our three year Artistic Excellence Campaign, which surpassed our goal of \$3 million. This important milestone will help to create an enduring legacy for the Symphony. We extend heartfelt thanks and appreciation to all of our donors who supported the Campaign, and for your ongoing and unwavering support of our artistic endeavours. Special thanks as well to our outstanding musicians for their continued impressive artistic achievements, and to our

staff for their tireless dedication and energy in supporting the efforts and goals of the Victoria Symphony.

Our Education Outreach program expanded its reach to over 17,000 students in the community with the delivery of Masterclasses, Education Concerts, Take Note, Music in Schools and other outreach activities. And our summer signature event, Victoria Symphony Splash, was hugely successful in its 28th year attracting over 40,000 people to share in the music, fireworks, and extraordinary sense of community.

Our dedicated Board of Directors and administration set and achieved goals in alignment with our strategic plan that contribute to our commitment to financial sustainability, building a diversified audience, raising the artistic level of our endeavours and extending our reach into the community. In addition, the Board and administration engaged in a collective bargaining process resulting in a new 4 year Master Agreement with the orchestra players.

We have entered into a new era for the Victoria Symphony under Christian's charismatic musical direction. With the support of our loyal donors, patrons, Board members, musicians and staff we are poised for an innovative, thoughtful and thrilling artistic journey that will not only surprise and delight, but support our goal of enriching lives through extraordinary music.

Music Director's Report

It has now been exactly a year since I took over the post as Music Director of the Victoria Symphony. And what a ride this has been!

From our very first concerts together, before I was asked to take over the position, I felt a certain connection with the orchestra, a willingness to explore new ways, a sincere focus on making music and a mutual respect on both a human and an artistic level.

During the 2017/18 season my own enthusiasm in working with the Victoria Symphony has not become any less. It is fuelled by the enthusiasm I feel from the musicians, which continues to motivate me to seek new ways to both sustain, enjoy and develop this wonderful group of musicians and personalities that I am privileged to stand in front of.

Since this is my first Music Director position of a professional orchestra, a lot of thoughts have been going through my mind, during this first season. I want to be honest and share with you, that besides leading the orchestra with a steady hand on- and off stage, I've also been busy learning! I sincerely believe that being a conductor, comes with the greatest of responsibilities. It is certainly not a job to take lightly. But why is this? Is it not just music, fun and enjoying yourself? Well, not quite. Some of our audience members, donors and supporters will know the responsibility of being a leader. But being a conductor is something on top of "just" being a leader. Not only do you have the human responsibility, treating your musicians with respect and taking the right decisions off-stage, but when you are on stage, you will get an immediate response to your musical decisions; a moment of bad judgement from the conductor, can ruin an essential musical moment!

So, having already had many incredible musical moments with the Victoria Symphony during this first year, I have started to realise that forming a clear artistic vision as a Music Director of a professional orchestra is a very similar process to what is happening in the moment on stage: We should always start by asking: "why?" and "how?" These two words are the key for me, when I am in front of any orchestra, trying to communicate my vision for our common musical direction. It comes down to the smallest elements of micromanagement: rhythm, phrasing, ensemble, sound, volume etc. And being a music director is exactly this same process - just on a macro level.

As Music Director of an orchestra, I must continue to ask myself why I want to develop the organisation in a certain artistic direction and produce a clear vision about how to get there. In that process, the wonderful musicians of the Victoria Symphony have granted me a large part of the answer, through our first year together on stage:

Good music is made in the moment - a good orchestra is made by many moments of good music! This way, music becomes both our *why* and *how*.

Treasurer's Report

I'm pleased to submit the Treasurer's Report for the Victoria Symphony Society's (VSS) 2017-18 fiscal year.

The VSS recorded solid financial results for the year ended May 31, 2017, with an excess of revenues over expenses of \$11,540. In the inaugural season with our new Music Director, Christian Kluxen, strong ticket sales combined with higher fundraising and donations to drive increased revenues year over year. This helped to offset higher artistic expenses as the VSS stays committed to investing in the quality of our music. As in previous years, the management team did an outstanding job of controlling overall expenses to keep Net Income relatively flat year over year.

In February 2018, the VSS hired a new Finance Director, Jennifer Paget, on a one year contract. Jennifer brings a wealth of experience to the position as the former Director of Finance at the Sooke School District 62, and

previously as Manager and Auditor in the BC Provincial Office of the Auditor General. She has adapted very well in this position and we look forward to her continued success with VSS.

The Executive and Finance Committee of the Board have responsibility for overseeing the financial aspects of the Symphony's operations. At each of our meetings a considerable amount of time was spent dealing with the Society's results and its prospects for the balance of the year. The Committee also spent time reviewing various drafts of the budget for the 2018-19 fiscal year.

The VSS is currently in a stable financial position and looks forward to the launch of an exciting 2018-19 season.

The Foundation for the VS Report

The Foundation for the Victoria Symphony was incorporated under the BC Societies Act in 1958 to provide long term support to the Victoria Symphony Society (VSS) in the advancement of orchestral music. The Foundation operates separately from the VSS as its own Society and is governed by a board of eight Directors. Funds invested by the Foundation generate earnings in the form of income, dividends and capital gains that contribute to the funding of the VSS. Donations received by the VSS throughout each year as part of annual fundraising are used by the Symphony to support ongoing operations. Contributions used to support the future operations of the Symphony are received by the Foundation and are invested by our Portfolio Manager (Jarislowsky Fraser Global Investment Management) under the guidance of the Directors.

At the close of the fiscal year 2017-18 for the Foundation for the Victoria Symphony, we look back at another good year with 2 important milestones being met. Thanks to the generosity of many, the Artistic Excellence campaign exceeded its \$3 million goal which, in part will help the Foundation on its way to a goal of \$1 million in unrestricted funds. The second milestone was that our assets under management exceeded the \$10 million mark for the first time ever.

The Foundation continued its support to the Symphony this past fiscal year with a contribution of \$650,000 compared to \$495,000 the previous year. Investment returns are holding at a 2-year annualized gain of 6.65% despite increased volatility and an unpredictable geopolitical climate. Interest from donors participating in the match program from Canadian Heritage – Endowment Incentives continues to grow although this past year saw a somewhat reduced match percentage contribution in the Federal government program.

The Foundation Board will endeavour to welcome two new Directors in the fall, one to fill the departure of Mr. Harry Swain, to whom we all owe great thanks for his unwavering support to both the Symphony and Foundation over many years. The Development Team has added a new member; Colleen Youngblut, Senior Development Officer who will support Lorraine Tanner with the Foundation and Symphony.

Thank you to all donors and supporters of the Foundation for the Victoria Symphony for helping our beloved Symphony reach new heights and “keep the music playing”.


