







SEASON AT A GLANCE

The Victoria Symphony's 80th season played out in dramatic fashion, bringing unprecedented new challenges and opportunities for re-imagining how we connect with audiences. Featuring over 20 beautifully produced online events, this was a uniquely challenging but ultimately very successful year for the organization.

HIDDEN GEMS OF THE CLASSICAL CANNON

The pivot to the digital medium, and the venue and physical distancing constraints of the pandemic provided the orchestra with the unique chance to perform works designed for chamber orchestras and smaller ensembles as well as music by lesser well known, but exciting composers. In addition to performing works like Vivaldi's *Four Seasons*, Mozart's Horn Concertos, and Haydn Symphonies, we recorded major works by Joseph Bologne (Le Chevalier de Saint-George), Louise Farrenc, Francis Poulenc, and a host of talented contemporary Canadian composers that we continue to be proud to champion.

Although unable to visit Victoria in person, Maestro Christian Kluxen played a central role in programming the entire season. A highlight was his program entitled "A Greeting from Denmark". With a focus on Nielsen's *Little Suite* and the *Nordic Suite* by the Danish String Quartet, this program helped us all feel a little closer to our musical leader despite the great physical distance between us.

GUEST ARTISTS, CONDUCTORS AND MORE

Due to ever changing travel restrictions and quarantine regulations, the Victoria Symphony looked upon the pandemic constraints as a chance to strengthen relationships with cherished local, regional, and Canadian artists. Some notable guest appearances included an electrifying performance of Beethoven's Concerto for Violin, Cello and Piano featuring pianist Lorraine Min, VS concert master Terence Tam, and VS principal cello Brian Yoon, as well as the return of star pianist, Angela Hewitt, who gave a thrilling performance of J.S. Bach's Keyboard Concerto in D minor. Also of note was the return of beloved former VS Music Director Maestra Tania Miller for a performance of Appalachian Spring and the opportunity for the orchestra to partner once again with harpsichordist and conductor Alexander Weimann for two programs of late 18th century music. Perhaps most extraordinary, however, was the way in which our Associate Conductor, Giuseppe Pietraroia took up the baton, week after week. This season would not have been possible without his artistic guidance, patience, and generosity of spirit, and we could not be more grateful.

This season saw the continuation of our long term and highly successful partnership with Pacific Opera Victoria. Our co-production of Benjamin Britten's *Phaedra* and his Serenade for Tenor, Horn and Strings was deeply musically

satisfying, and a rare opportunity to hear these works of genius in creative and visually appealing semi-stagings. The collaboration with POV also extended this year to include the creation of a new summer music festival. "Open Air: A Summer Festival of Music", although quickly conceived and executed, was fully embraced by the community and a wonderful transition back into the world of in-person music making.

Special thanks must be offered to our venue partners, who all worked collaboratively with us to make things happen in difficult circumstances. The Farquhar at UVic, the Royal Theatre, and Christ Church Cathedral were all uniformly helpful and we are grateful for their continued collaboration.

VS@HOME AND VS VIGNETTES

To stay connected with the audience, Victoria Symphony musicians created "VS@Home" a series of homemade videos featuring a variety of intimate musical performances, messages of thanks, and anecdotal insights into the lives of VS musicians. In a similar vein, the "VS Vignettes" series, produced by VS musician Marcus Hissen, provided captivating and sometimes surprising context on the lives of our multi-talented and eclectic musicians. We look forward to continuing this series and sharing more background on the diverse and extraordinary people who make up the orchestra.

VIRTUAL GALA AND SUPPORT

Although not able to meet in person this year, the Victoria Symphony held a "Spectacular Spring Virtual Gala" featuring uplifting music from the orchestra, transformational stories from musical celebrities, fine wine, and gourmet food delivered to people's homes. Despite being our first foray into the world of virtual fundraising, it was a smashing success and was a key piece in being able to secure the full compensation of the musicians for the 2021-22 Season.

With the generous support of our donor community, corporate sponsors, local, provincial, and federal governments, over the last year, the Victoria Symphony produced a virtual season enjoyed by hundreds of thousands of people. With restrictions easing and a sense of normalcy returning, we plan on remaining at the center of Victoria's cultural life for years to come.

We thank you for your continued support.

I am proud of how the Victoria Symphony has managed to deal with these new problems. While I am the notional head of the organization, the last 16 months or so could not have passed so well for us without the dogged determination and hard work of all our staff, musicians, conductors and board members. To all of you, a heartfelt thank you.

This is my last message as President as I retire from the board at this year's Annual General Meeting. It has been a real pleasure to occupy this position and do my part to contribute to the success of the symphony. Thanks to all who assisted and best wishes for continued success in the years ahead.

Your stewardship has clearly been a central part of this organization's success over the last seven years. The whole VS board must also be acknowledged for the huge amount of time they have committed this year to assuring our artistic momentum without unduly risking the financial health of the society. They have allowed us to take measured risks and the results speak for themselves.

My experience with the whole VS admin team this year has been terrific. You have been patient, creative, flexible, and inspiringly collaborative. I can hardly wait to see what we can accomplish when we don't have to change plans five times over!

To our loyal VS Donors and to our government funding agencies, you have made it possible for us to both survive and imagine a brighter future. Thank you.

Finally, to the VS musicians, you are an inspiring group of artists for whom to work. I will continue to do my best to secure your vital role in the broader community.

MUSIC DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The 2020-21 season must have been the strangest in the history of the Victoria Symphony. As COVID regulations continued to tighten an already narrow situation, strategic planning on an artistic level, became increasingly complex and frustrating. Nevertheless, looking back on the past year, it has ultimately been a rewarding process to explore new possibilities within the constraints.

Firstly, we had to secure a platform to stay in contact with our community and to continue delivering great musical experiences to our audience. This meant quickly building a virtual presence capable of communicating our artistic vision in a way that was as close to the in-person experience as possible, while also taking advantage of the uniquely up-close and intimate characteristics of the digital platform.

To me, "quality" has been the key word all the way. From my Copenhagen residence, I stayed connected on a daily basis with the whole Victoria-based team to assure the highest quality for our virtual concerts. When looking back at the season, I am proud to say that everyone, especially our incredible musicians, have risen to the occasion and delivered some truly outstanding performances.

Despite the challenges, this season was, in a strange way, satisfying and memorable. We made the best of the situation and managed to draw out all the artistic potential we could from the circumstances.

To highlight a few of these unexpected gains from the 20-21 season. We:

 Built a strong virtual presence which I sincerely hope will continue even after the pandemic.

- Explored the exciting pool of local and regional talent while developing relationships with new guest artists which, I hope to further develop in the future.
- Expanded the orchestra's repertoire by exploring smaller sized symphonic works.
- Developed the orchestra's ability to play in smaller groups, and often even without a conductor, which put more responsibility on each individual player.
- Developed a closer relationship with Christ Church Cathedral who have been wonderful partners all year long.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to our new CEO, Matthew White for his endless patience, positive and empathetic leadership as well as his inextinguishable dedication to music.

My deepfelt admiration and thanks goes to the whole management team and their continued flexibility. But most of all, the gratitude that I feel towards our Associate Conductor Giuseppe Pietraroia, is beyond comprehension. Through his commitment and immensely hard work on the podium this year he has helped to secure the orchestra's continued growth and for that I am thankful.

Last but not least, thank you my dear Victoria Symphony musicians. You have done an amazing job. I miss you and cannot wait for our reconnection in the 21-22 season.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to submit the Treasurer's Report for the Victoria Symphony Society's (VSS) 2020-21 fiscal year.

Despite the challenges presented by COVID, VSS had an extraordinary year with total earnings increasing 178% from the prior year. Earned income decreased 95% but was more than offset by increases in donations and government grants. New grant opportunities, continued government subsidies, generous patrons, and substantial bequests contributed to a 6% increase in total revenues over the prior year.

Operational expenses were also well managed at almost 6% below budget as operations were reduced and the organization transitioned to a virtual format. Total expenses were 3% lower than the prior year, due to a large transfer to the Foundation for the Victoria Symphony. These funds remain available to the VSS as it works to realign the concert season to reflect pre-pandemic programming.

The Executive and Finance Committee of the Board have responsibility for overseeing the financial aspects of

the Symphony's operations. At each of our meetings, this past year a considerable amount of time was spent dealing with the Society's results, programming options during COVID, as well as the outlook for the balance of the year. The Committee also spent time reviewing various drafts of the budget for the 2021-22 fiscal year.

In a year that required the VSS to pivot dramatically to accommodate the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, I would like to thank the staff and musicians for their flexibility and commitment to creating innovative content that continued to engage our audiences in new ways. The generosity and loyalty of VSS patrons during this difficult time has been inspiring and reinforces our pursuit of delivering extraordinary musical experiences for our community.

THE FOUNDATION FOR THE VS

The Foundation for the Victoria Symphony was incorporated under the BC Societies Act in 1958 to provide long term support to the Victoria Symphony Society (VSS) in the advancement of orchestral music. The Foundation operates separately from the VSS as its own Society and is governed by a board of eight Directors plus 2 designates from the Symphony. Funds invested by the Foundation generate earnings in the form of income, dividends and capital gains that contribute to the operational funding of the VSS. Donations received by the VSS throughout each year as part of annual fundraising are used by the Symphony to support ongoing operations. Contributions used to support the future operations of the Symphony are received by the Foundation and are invested by our Portfolio Manager (Jarislowsky, Fraser Global Investment Management) under the prudent governance of the Foundation's Directors.

Although it has been a most unusual year for our beloved Symphony, the Foundation has experienced a year of many generous donations and bequests as well as strong investment growth. Endowment from donors participating in the match program from Canadian Heritage – Endowment Incentives added \$115,590. The Foundation also initiated a "Future Fund" this year funded with unrestricted assets with a more conservative investment philosophy and a cap of \$3 million to provide the Symphony with operating or emergency funding during financially challenging periods. As at May

31st fiscal year end the Endowment Fund held \$ 11.1 million and the Future Fund held \$ 2.3 million in invested assets.

The Foundation continued its support to the Symphony this past fiscal year with a contribution of \$400,000. Annualized 1-year investment gain was 15.6% during COVID-19 related market volatility. Since engaging Jarislowsky Fraser as portfolio managers in January 2016, we have maintained an annualized (year over year) gain of 7.79% while distributing to the Symphony.

I have personally reached my 6 year term limit at the Foundation and will be proposing to hand the reigns to Terry Scandrett at the upcoming AGM. I would like to thank the Foundation Board Members for helping us to nearly double assets under management during my term while distributing \$ 3.46 million in operating funds to the Symphony. I would like to express my sincere thanks to all donors and supporters of the Foundation allowing it to support of our beloved Symphony to reach new heights and "keep the music playing".

MUSICIANS' REPORT

In honour of the many shifts of perspective we encountered throughout the year, the musicians of the Victoria Symphony informally christened 2020-'21 the "Subject to Change" Season. Our first Virtual Season required constant learning and adaptation on all levels throughout our organization. On an artistic level, like all orchestras this year, we found ways to maintain musical communication while distanced. Working hard to give the energy of live performance to an empty hall, we built positive new working relationships with executive producer Theresa Leonard, sound recordist Paul Luchkow & video producer Mike Walker with his team at Roll.Focus.

In regards to leadership, this season offered us a great opportunity to deepen our working relationship with Associate Conductor Giuseppe Pietraroia. In spite of the many changes that came his way, we saw Joey rise to the challenge again and again, as he showed himself to be a true friend to the Victoria Symphony. Highlights in our work with him include the "A la Française" concert program, the Shostakovich Chamber Symphony in C Minor, the Poulenc Organ Concerto and the Beethoven Triple Concerto.

Another shift showed VS Concertmaster Terry Tam extending his musical talents to the role of conductor/leader several times this year. Terry's performance of Vivaldi's *Four Seasons* and the concert he led featuring Angela Hewett performing the music of Bach have become ongoing favourites with our online audience. Incidentally, Terry also contributed beautiful performances as soloist in the Beethoven Triple Concerto and the Mendelssohn Violin Concerto.

Several of the orchestra's principals extended their roles as well by stepping up as soloists in concertos. Brian Yoon, Ryan Cole, Alana Despins and Mike Oswald all shone in their turns on the stage.

Beyond the countless demands for flexibility required by the pandemic, the VS office experienced a tectonic shift in personnel this year. All our office staff, including our new CEO Matthew White, our new Orchestra Manager Eric Gallipo, and our new Operations Manager Liz King faced many sink or swim situations in this most difficult year. We thank them for staying calm, kind and safe in spite of the left curves that have still not stopped coming and for giving so much to the VS.

There were heavy disappointments. Travel restrictions kept us from working with our Music Director Christian Kluxen, whose presence unites the musicians in profound musical connection. In addition, the VS lost two musical friends with the unfortunate passing of Michael Jarvis and Jeanne Lamon. They will be sorely missed.

The pandemic demanded serious adaptation on the part of our Board, as well. The musicians recognize the commitment to the orchestra's future that the Board made by backing the Virtual Season. Due to the months spent recording and streaming, the Victoria Symphony as a whole accrued innumerable benefits. Thanks to the Board's commitment, these benefits will likely last in ways that will make the impacts of the pandemic not only changes, but positive and lasting transformations.
