

vsNEW - Victoria Symphony New Explorations Workshops 2025-26

vsNEW is an innovative program in which young students can explore and experiment with composition and write new works for a small ensemble of dedicated Victoria Symphony Musicians. 2025-26 is the 20th year vsNEW has been a part of the VS Education programs.

This year vsNEW is led by Composer-Mentor Taylor Brook and an ensemble of VS musicians. The sessions take place on most Wednesday evenings 6.30-8pm from September through March during school term. These sessions include meetings with an ensemble of musicians where composers bring their pieces in various stages of completion to be read through by the musicians, which is followed by discussion. From the most basic to the most complex, many musical issues arise and it is a great learning experience for everyone. There are also monthly seminars and private lessons with the Composer-Mentor. Private lesson times will be arranged after the first meeting. This season's program will be a collaboration with the Art Gallery of Greater Victoria, and the students are invited to choose a piece of artwork from the gallery to use as inspiration for their composition. The program culminates in a final performance at the Art Gallery on April 11th. There are no fees to participate.

The Program is unique and only one of its kind in Canada. The Victoria Symphony is proud of this program's success and many young composers have won local, provincial and even national awards through it.

Requirements for student participation:

- 1. Age range 11-18 (Middle School to High School)
- 2. Some prior composing experience. This can be a song, a solo instrument work, or a piece with multiple instruments.
- 3. The ability to properly notate Western staff notation and have experience writing your own music. The musicians will be reading directly from the students' scores/ parts. Students will be expected to provide pdfs of parts and scores approximately one week prior to each workshop with musicians.
- 4. Participation at all workshops is expected, except in the case of emergencies or sickness. Any foreseeable absences due to other commitments need to be discussed and approved well in advance.


